CNR Legacy Council Update

CNR Legacy Co-Lead Rosa Napoleone welcomed everyone to the January 10th meeting, including special guest Dr. Susan Parish, the new President of Mercy University. The opening prayer was offered by Pearl Sullivan SNR '03, GS '15.

Following the prayer, CNR Legacy Co-Lead Marlene Tutera introduced President Parish and then turned the meeting over to her so she could directly address the Legacy Council members in attendance. Marlene was thanked for her kindness and support as a member of the Mercy Board of Trustees, and for providing Dr. Parish with an understanding of the role CNR now plays at Mercy.

The first and most important message President Parish wanted to convey was that she is fully committed to continuing Tim Hall's pledge to ensure that CNR's Legacy is preserved. She mentioned the similarity in missions to service that both CNR and Mercy share.

President Parish then discussed the four priorities that she has set forth for Mercy:

- Priority 1 is to create an exceptional student experience for every student at every moment throughout the student's journey, whether it be in the classroom, the dining halls, the dorms, etc.
- Priority 2 is aimed at doubling the on-time graduation rate over the next four years.
 Although Mercy is on target with peer institutions in terms of the number of students that graduate on time, a more rigorous approach is required to ensure students graduate on time, thereby minimizing the amount of student debt that is carried throughout their lifetimes.
- Priority 3 seeks to create an environment of excellence in the workplace for all Mercy employees, one that honors, values, and respects all employees regardless of their role.
- Priority 4 is centered on ensuring Mercy's financial sustainability going forward.

The meeting was then opened up for Q&A with President Parish. The dialogue that followed was chiefly centered around what the CNR Legacy Council could be doing to support Mercy. Apart from fulfilling the need for scholarship funding by virtue of their own donations, through their many connections CNR alums can also assist Mercy in finding other sources of financial support, e.g., patrons, foundations, etc. Additionally, support can be provided to students by alumni in practical areas such as how to study effectively, how to apply for jobs, how to set up their LinkedIn profiles, serve as a resource to provide or hire students for internships, etc.

President Parish mentioned that Bernadette Wade has been charged with developing a mentoring program. Bernadette was reminded to keep the Networking/Career Development committee in mind for anything they could do to assist in this effort.

Bernadette Wade SAS '80 and Chief Advancement Officer for Mercy University updated the group:

- Bernadette announced that this year's CNR Legacy Award at the Trustees' Dinner will be presented to Pat Keegan Abels SAS '73, who Bernadette said exemplifies the CNR Legacy. The dinner will be held on Thursday, May 2 at the Glen Island Harbour Club in New Rochelle.
- Though it has been mentioned before, Bernadette once again wanted to update everyone on the launch for the new School of Nursing, which is being led by Dean Kenya Beard.
- There is a search underway for a new dean for the School of Business as former Dean Lloyd Gibson stepped down in December.

Tara Alfano, SAS '02, GS'04 and Director of Development – CNR, provided some updates:

- A joint holiday party gathering for the CNR/Mercy alumni councils was held on December 16th at the Moller House with approximately 25 attendees.
