

HOW CAN I POSSIBLY REMEMBER ALL MY PASSWORDS ???!

Do you tend to use the same password for all, or many, of your accounts? Doing so can put you at great risk! In the event that your password is discovered, all of your accounts could be compromised.

While complex, unique, passwords for each account offer better protection, they can, however, create a nightmare in terms of trying to remember all your passwords.

Password managers can offer a solution to this dilemma. A password manager is a tool that helps users manage their passwords across multiple accounts. Usernames and passwords are stored in an encrypted database and managed by the password manager. These are accessed by way of a master password and two-factor authentication (the latter is in widespread use these days, i.e., when a user receives a one-time use code via text or email that completes the logon process).

Among the commonly used products are Bitwarden, 1Password, Dashlane, NordPass, and Roboform. Some are free and some charge a fee.
